- "Bus Tracker" feature which shows close bus stops according to your location
- We are continuing to seek reasons for users to continuously use the app
- Q: We just got these planners, and there are some benefits listed. Can those be added to the list of opportunities for students to save money?
  - \$6.50 movie tickets in OSA
- Campus Stored Value Payment Card System
  - Something proposed from student congress about 4 Student Congress' ago (4 years ago)
  - It's one card that you can use to pay on campus; like a university card
  - Enhanced ID Will be able to tell if you are a current student
  - RIO Fundraisers can use it for fundraisers, since it is a cashless system
  - Other Possible Uses: physical access control with special labs on campus, pay at vending machines
  - Load with credit card online or cash
     with cashiers office or tap to pay
  - Transaction cost: 1.95%
