- After they remodel, is there a way the cafeteria can be more sustainable?

Alternative Energy - PV

- Toward the end of the Spring, they will be breaking ground for PhotoVoltaics (PV) which will provide about 74-76 percent of the campus' energy
- Another project in Manono Building: Its being entirely shutdown and will be renovated in March (same as bookstore)
- PV covering some parking areas, and ground based
- There will be battery storage on campus since we will be having PV

Questions and Discussions

- Question from ESW: "Green Roofs", is that possible if PV is put on the roofs?
 - It will be difficult for them to implement. The problem for doing that in campus is it was not made for that, it has to be on the correct building

- Question: How will the campus be serving food?
 - Everything in the cafeteria will be closed
 EXCEPT the kitchen. Initial thought is
 putting a tent in the middle of the
 campus.
 - The Culinary Program has proposed to be food tents (likely 4) throughout the campus instead of one central tent.
- Question: Any updates going forward?
 - Three methods: (1) You can always ask
 Brian Furuto. (2) They are trying to put information on the Kapiolani website.
 (3) An email blast throughout the campus.
- Question: Will there be seating?
 - The food tents will be in areas where there is shaded seating. Four locations of 10 x 10 tents, will be shaded chairs and tables near by, not putting up 24/7 because of the weather.
- Question: What will the hours be?
 - Unsure. But if you go to the cafeteria, there are leave pamphlets on the table that gives information about the operations
- Question: Will the campus parking be impacted?
